A U.S. Navy veteran, served in San Diego as a ASN P-3 Analyst. Married to a World War II Officer. Together raising 4 children.

Julie began her relationship with Post 790 as a Legionnaire. She then continued through all the various chairs becoming the only woman Post Commander. Julie was also a member of the Women's Auxiliary Unit of Post 790, serving on their board in various chair positions for many years then becoming Auxiliary President for 4 years. Her last few years she served as Post 790's Adjutant and also continued on the Auxiliary board.

Julie Potter was a determined and dedicated person. She had no means of transportation but she always found a way to get to all of the meetings for Post 790, District, and LACC. She was a critical link between these agencies and our Post. Julie always apprised us of what was going on and helped us with many different legion programs, keeping Post 790 involved and up to date with all state veteran projects. She was involved with our Sons of the Legionnaire program. Assisting with sign ups, memberships and advising them of the proper By-Laws. She strengthened the relationship between the Sons and the Legionaries making the program what it is today at Post 790. Julie was also very instrumental working with the Girls State program for Post 790.

You could always find Julie in the back office of Post 790 making sure that all correct paperwork was completed and submitted. Many sought her out for advice, both for legion business or just to get personal advice. She always had time for others.

Julie did so much for Post 790 over the many years and was a true example of an exemplary soldier, both when she was in the Navy and after her discharge, giving so much of her time to all Veterans. Julie Potter is deeply missed but will never be forgotten.
